Becoming an apprentice is the smart way to achieve a tertiary qualification. Successful apprentices gain the New Zealand Certificate in Hairdressing (Professional Stylist) (Level 4).

Train on the job

You'll train in a real salon and work with real clients. Your trainers will be qualified industry professionals.

As apprentice training takes place on the job, you can earn an income while you learn.

How an apprenticeship works


A hairdressing apprenticeship takes approximately three to four years to complete.

HITO supports the apprentice and employer during the qualification by:

- Visiting the apprentice and their employer regularly to provide training support, guidance and pastoral care
- Providing training resources to guide the apprentice through the practical and theoretical components of the qualification
- Arranging off-job training with an accredited provider for assessments and some theoretical components
- Providing a qualified assessor to evaluate progress
- Providing training resources to help the employer train their apprentice

The apprentice:

- Works with a qualified trainer towards their on-job tertiary qualification
- Completes theory assessments, case studies, and practical assessments as they work towards their qualification
- Gains work experience in their chosen career while achieving a recognized NZQA qualification.
