HITO Gateway Programme

HITO's Gateway programme gives secondary school students the opportunity to experience what it's like to work in the hairdressing, barbering or beauty therapy industries, to help make an informed decision about their future career.

Work-based programmes involve spending one day per week in the workplace, there is a minimum of 10 days required to complete the programme. Students must have a placement before they can take part, the workplace must have someone qualified to supervise the student.

Theory-only programmes do not require a work placement and allow students the opportunity to learn about our industries.

Gateway students often go on to find successful employment as an apprentice.

How it works



The school contacts HITO



Exchange of enrolment forms

HITO sends a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) and enrolment forms to the school. The school signs the forms and returns it to HITO.



The school finds a placement - *work-based programmes*

HITO Sales and Training Advisors may be able to assist if they know of an employer seeking a Gateway student. HITO sends training materials to the school.



HITO sends training materials to the school



The student works through the units

For the work-based programmes, there are a mixture of theory and practical components to complete.



Once complete, the Gateway Coordinator sends a copy of the assessment to HITO for marking



A HITO Industry Marker will mark the units



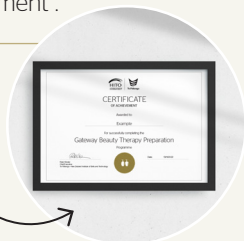
HITO will register the units with NZQA

HITO sends the school a "Confirmation of Achievement".

Once all units are achieved the student is awarded a certificate of achievement by HITO.

In 2020, forklift driver James Harrington googled “jobs where you can talk and not get told off”. After coming across barbering as a career where conversations are encouraged, James decided to begin his journey into barbering.

Starting out barbering in his garage, he quickly realised he needed more guidance, and began training as a HITO apprentice at The Barber Lounge in Christchurch.

“I wanted to train and get qualified but being 26 and having bills to pay meant I couldn’t take time out to do a course,” says James. “A HITO apprenticeship gave me the flexibility to learn, work and earn at the same time.”

In 2022, James’ passion and drive earned him The Barbering Apprentice of the Year award at The Industry Awards.

Teegan Hazelwood was introduced to the beauty industry as a teenager, sitting as a model for her mum, who was training to become a beauty therapist. After completing high school and working full time for a while, Teegan decided that she wanted a qualification under her belt. Her familiarity with the beauty industry meant a career in beauty was her first choice. When looking into different study options, Teegan discovered HITO and beauty therapy apprenticeships.

“Working in a real clinic made study a lot less daunting,” says Teegan. “You’ve got qualified beauty therapists around you in the clinic every day; there is always someone you can call out to for help, so you don’t feel like you’re doing it on your own.”

In 2022, Teegan completed her apprenticeship and gained the New Zealand Certificate in Beauty Therapy (Level 4).
